1 What's your vision?

Having a clear vision of your playground's purpose is the first step to planning, designing and building a brilliant play experience for your students.

- **Who will play there?** Consider the ages, stages and abilities of your students.
- **How many children** will use it at once?
- **What kind of play experience** and opportunities do you want to provide? Active play, fun and fitness? Social interaction? Imaginative play? Safe challenges and adventures? **Or all the above!**
- **What 'look' do you want?** Do you want your playground to complement or blend with your buildings and grounds or stand out and make a statement?

2 What are your play priorities?

Today's school playgrounds are so much more than just places for children to burn off their youthful energy on their lunch breaks or before the school bell rings.

They play a vital role in helping you achieve your school's student wellbeing and educational goals – supporting 'whole child' development and complementing classroom-based activities.

- Are you creating an **inclusive play experience** that caters to the diverse physical, social and sensory developmental stages and needs of your students?
- Is it just a play space, or is it a **learning space too?** Do you require a layout and other equipment or facilities to create an outdoor classroom?
- Are there specific areas of **your curriculum** you want your playground to support, such as Physical Education or STEM?

3 Who needs to be involved?

Collaboration is the key to every successful playground project. Decide who you need to consult up-front and how you'll keep them informed and involved.

Planning a school playground means considering the needs and expectations of:

- **Students**
- **Parents**
- **Teachers**
- The school's **board** and **management**
- Maintenance **staff**.

What are the site considerations?

Let's get down to the details!

- What are the **exact dimensions** of the space available?
- **How exposed** is it to the elements (wind, heat, snow)?
- What can you use to your advantage, such as **existing trees for shade**?
- What are the drainage and **soil conditions**?
- Are there any **challenges** or constraints (e.g. slopes).
- For a playground upgrade: is there **existing play equipment** to be incorporated or removed?
- What type of **safety surfacing** is required?
- Are you going to use natural shade or a **commercial shade system**?

Lead by example and select sustainably made play equipment.

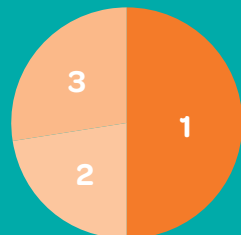




5 What is your budget?

The cost to build a playground depends on a whole number of factors ranging from the size of your playground to the play equipment and materials you choose. A playground specialist can help you squeeze more out of your budget by optimising the use of the available space and helping you select equipment which delivers 'maximum play value'.

Estimated cost breakdown



1: Playground Design & Equipment - 50-60%

2: Site Preparation, & Installation - 20-30%

3: Surfacing - 20-40%*

*Based on loose fill surfacing.

6 Playground design & equipment

Here's where the fun really begins! Designing a playground that meets your needs based on your space and play priorities.



Aesthetics

What look and feel do you want your playground to have?

There's no one size fits all approach to playgrounds when it comes to aesthetics. Contemporary play equipment offers a wide choice in terms of materials, colours and finishes. You can choose bright, vibrant colours or opt for more natural tones and textures. Your play space can also include colours, elements or themes that reflect your school's ethos or culture or takes its cues from your local culture and environment.



Equipment & layout

How will you piece together a fun, development-rich play experience?

The size of your play space and your play priorities will have the most significant influence on your choice of equipment and the layout of your playground.

Behind the drawcard of irresistible fun, every piece of equipment in your playground should have targeted health and social developmental benefits. The key is selecting a mix of equipment that provides a range of play types and benefits. For example, modular play systems and adventure towers can provide a multitude of play activities in one, compact structure. While individual pieces of equipment laid out like an obstacle course promotes fun and fitness. The addition of seating, tables and shelters can open the door to a multi-purpose play and learning space.

Budget tight?

You can design a space that allows equipment to be added when funding is available.

Investing in play equipment that's built to the highest standards of quality, durability and safety extends the life of your playground while minimising the cost of maintenance, repairs and replacement.

Inclusive and accessible

Are you passionate about making play more inclusive and accessible for children of different ages and abilities?

A truly inclusive playground makes interactive, social play more likely by enabling children with and without disabilities, to access and play on equipment together, enriching the play experience and fostering a strong appreciation of diversity. Consider the diverse needs of your students when selecting equipment and surfacing, and explore how the growing range of inclusive equipment, including swings, carousels, climbing structures, and even musical instruments, caters for different physical and sensory needs.



Safety

What safety standards and requirements need to be met?

Your playground should be built in accordance with the safety legislation in your location. Playground safety requirements can typically be found on Education Department websites, and a playground specialist will always be abreast of the relevant safety standards and guidelines.

Note: In New Zealand and Australia, appropriate surfacing is mandatory. The options include sand, wood mulch, rubber matting and all have pros and cons relating to maintenance, cost and accessibility.
